Tri-County Weed Control (TCWC) proposes to initiate an herbicide application for the City of Ely, NV for 2021; within the city limits targeting noxious/invasive weeds.

Approximate herbicide cost	\$310.00
Total cost	\$10,000.00
SNPLMA Portion 80%	\$8,000.00
Estimated Total Cost to city of Ely	\$2,000.00

This proposal is for the-2021 season proposed treatment only. The treatment will also include inventory of any new infestations. All treatments and inventories are recorded into a computer database with GPS locations. Shape files of the treatment will be supplied along with an associated photo attached and a detailed billing summary. Treatments in future years are subject to a subsequent proposal.

Covid-19 Update:

Total Cases: 575 Deaths: 6
Active: 6 Recovered: 563
Initiated Vaccines: 36.07% (state: 42.74%)

White Pine County Commissioners:

Voted to open WPC completely on May 1st 2021 and reversing all the State requirements and mandates. WPC will continue to monitor for outbreaks and if 3 out of 4 (75%) of the Covid-19 beds become utilized at the hospital, hold emergency meetings to slow the spread and deal with outbreaks.

Suggestions for Ely City:

- Continue to educate and inform Citizens as the needs arise.
 - Ely's business and citizens know how to prevent the spread and steps to take.
- Encourage business/citizens to respect each other's rights to wear/not wear masks and then be respectful of that choice.
- Continue to monitor for out breaks or events linked to certain business or activities.
 - If a pattern emerges address the concern quickly while working to keep activities going and commerce open.
- Support vaccine efforts as the needs arise
- Upcoming Events:
 - Longer parade routes to spread people out!
 - Increased hand sanitization stations at events.
 - Increase public restroom cleaning if done daily, consider 2x a day etc...
 - Encourage social distancing if possible.
