## Life Center Project

The Life Center facility will offer education for the management and prevention of diabetes for patients and families. The facility is 3,200 SQFT and located on the Ely Shoshone Reservation and projected for completion in January 2023. The facility will operate under the Special Diabetes Program for Indians and the Indian Health Service (IHS).

In 2022, 250 Native Americans in the White Pine County area received services or participated in the Ely Shoshone Tribe Diabetes Program. ~10 percent is diagnosed with diabetes, and currently receiving health care from the Newe Medical Clinic.

The Life Center will implement the following Best Practices:

1. **Diabetes Education** – We will utilize the space to aid in teaching individuals with diabetes how to manage the condition and prevent complications effectively. Various healthcare professionals, including certified diabetes educators, registered dietitians, and nurses, can provide diabetes education. We will focus instructions on the following:
  - 1.1. Understanding how diabetes can affect the body
  - 1.2. Monitoring blood sugar levels
  - 1.3. Proper ways to administer insulin injections or take oral medications
  - 1.4. Making healthy food choices and following a meal plan
  - 1.5. Staying active and maintaining a healthy weight.
  - 1.6. Recognizing and preventing complications of diabetes such as heart disease, nerve damage, and kidney disease.
  - 1.7. Managing stress and emotional well-being
  - 1.8. Understanding and using diabetes technology such as insulin pumps and continuous glucose monitoring systems.
2. **Exercise and wellness** – Regular physical activity can help improve insulin sensitivity, lower blood sugar levels, and reduce the risk of cardiovascular disease, which is a common complication of diabetes. Maintaining a healthy weight and eating a balanced diet can help manage diabetes.

Overall wellness, such as stress management and getting enough sleep, can also play a role in diabetes management. We can develop an exercise and wellness plan tailored to their specific needs and medical conditions by working with their healthcare providers.

3. **Diabetes counseling and support-** With our life center, we plan to offer support groups to provide a safe and supportive environment for individuals with diabetes to share their experiences and ask questions. In addition, it would be beneficial if we could offer counseling services to help individuals with diabetes cope with the emotional aspects of the disease, such as depression, anxiety, and stress. With this life center, we plan to offer a comprehensive approach to diabetes management, including education, support, counseling, medical management, lifestyle programs, and access to resources. They are ultimately leading to individuals with diabetes better managing their condition and improving their overall health.

4. **Diabetes prevention** – With our life center, we will strive to provide education on healthy lifestyle habits, including proper nutrition and regular physical activity. We are also hoping to offer classes and support groups for individuals at high risk of developing diabetes. With its proximity and our health complex, we hope to provide access to healthcare professionals who can also guide and manage diabetes risk factors.

The cost to date of the Life Center is \$700,000.00, and the projected cost to complete the Life Center is \$1,000,000.00. The Tribe is creating and maintaining partnerships to assist in completing the Life Center for ongoing and outstanding contributions to improvements in diabetes care.

**Monthly Operations Report for October 2023**

1. Locomotive Status – Updated
  - a. Locomotives in service: #93, #105, #310, 801, Wrecking Crane A & Rotary B.
  - b. Locomotive 81 is out-of-service with running gear and boiler issues.
  - c. Locomotive 204 is out of service with governor issues.
  - d. Locomotive 109 is out of service with a wheel set issues.
  - e. Locomotive 40 is out of service for her heavy repairs. We have started on her repairs; she will be out of service until 2025.
  - f. Locomotives out of service needing moderate repairs: #109 and #201.
  - g. Locomotives waiting funding for restoration: Steptoe Valley Smelting and Mining #309, Kennecott 802 and Rotary Snowplow B (for boiler overhaul.)
  - h. Locomotives out of service needing heavy repairs #80 and the military locomotives.
3. Rolling Stock Status – No change
  - a. Passenger equipment in service: #07, #08, #09, Flatcar #23, Coach #5, Baggage Car/RPO #20, Outfit Car #06.
  - b. Passenger equipment out of service: #10, #2 and #05 needing heavy repairs.
  - c. Caboose in service: #3 and #22 are operational.
  - d. Caboose out service: #5 and #6. Caboose #6 needs a 50-year waiver.
4. Track Status – No change
  - a. Keystone Branch is open.
  - b. Adverse Branch is open.
  - c. Museum Branch is open.
5. Ridership and Ticket Sales – Updated
  - a. In October we carried 2,407 passengers, this is an 26% increase over last year.
  - b. Year to date we have carried 14,322 passengers, this is even with 2022.
  - c. Since operations began in 1987, we have carried 359,760 passengers.
6. Economic Impact – Data from Travel Nevada Visitor Facts Pony Express 2016-2020  
 The average non-gaming & gaming daily expenditure per overnight visitor \$140.  
 Economic impact for October 2023 is 2,407 x 80% x 140 = \$269,584  
 Economic Impact Year To Date is 14,322 x 80% x 140 = \$1,604,064

8. The Eclipse

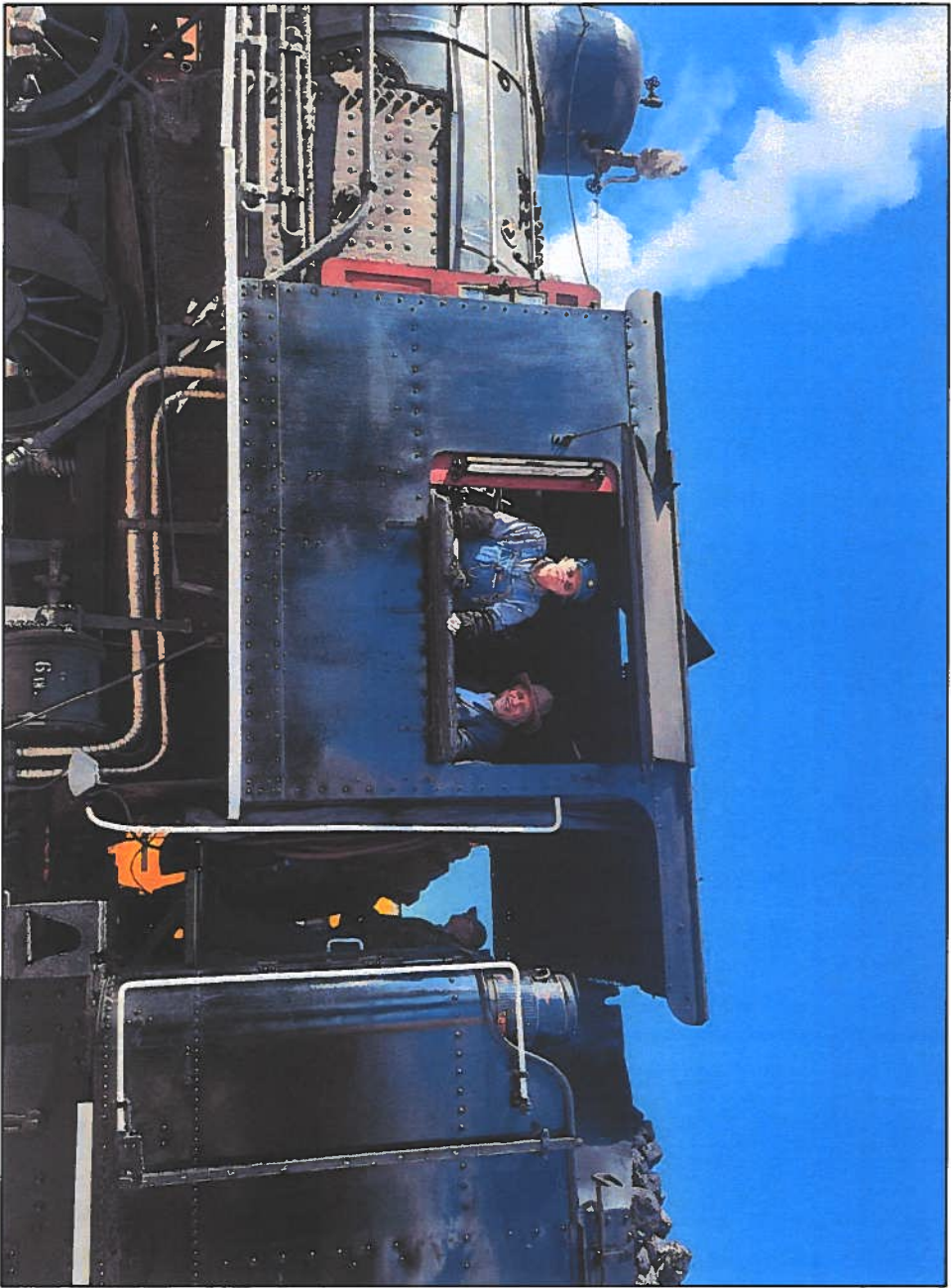

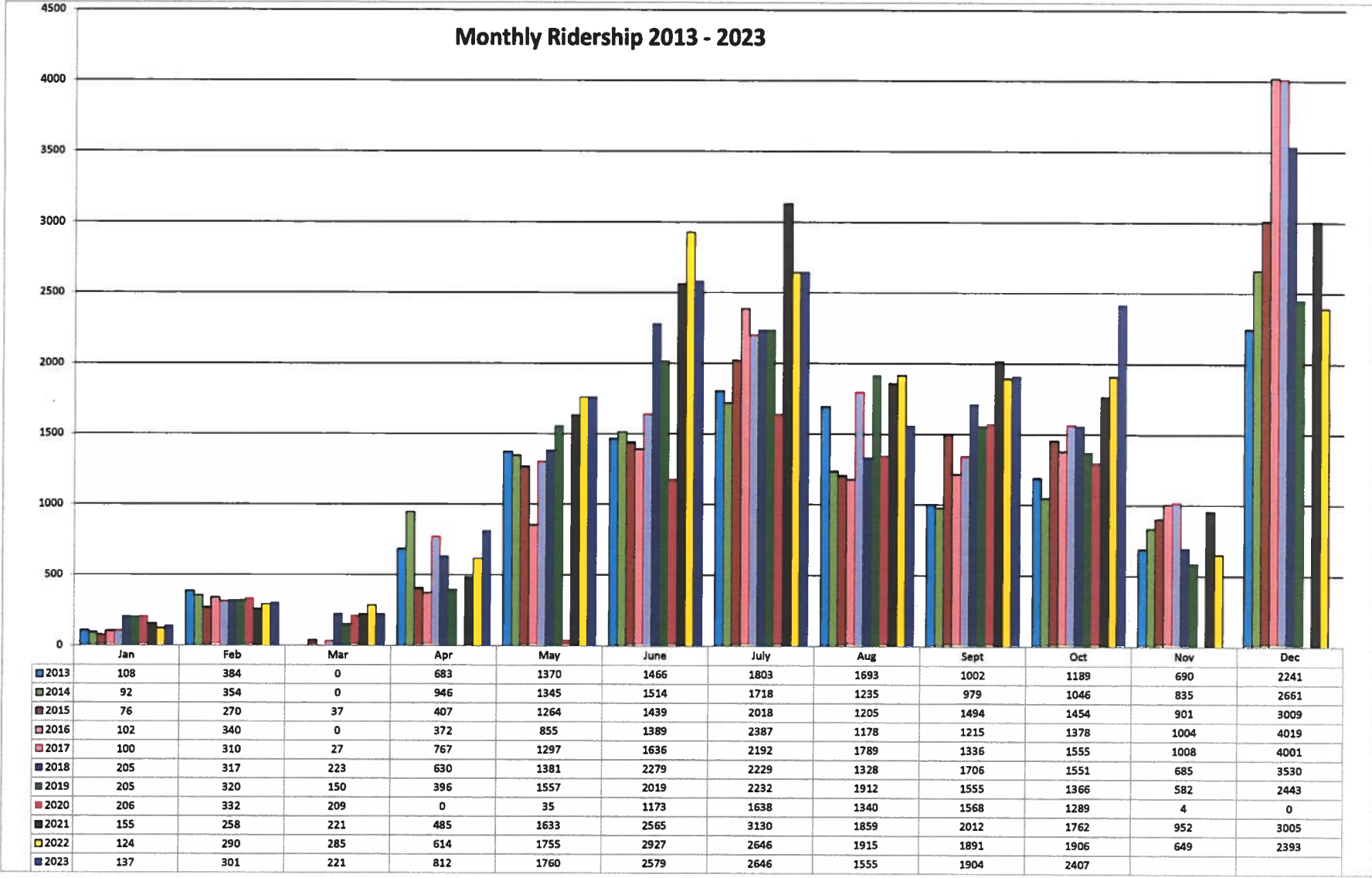


The Exploratorium provided eclipse glasses to the railroad. It was quite the honor to have the railroad's logo next to NASA's.



Nevada Lieutenant Governor Stavros Anthony tour the railroad and watched the eclipse from here.





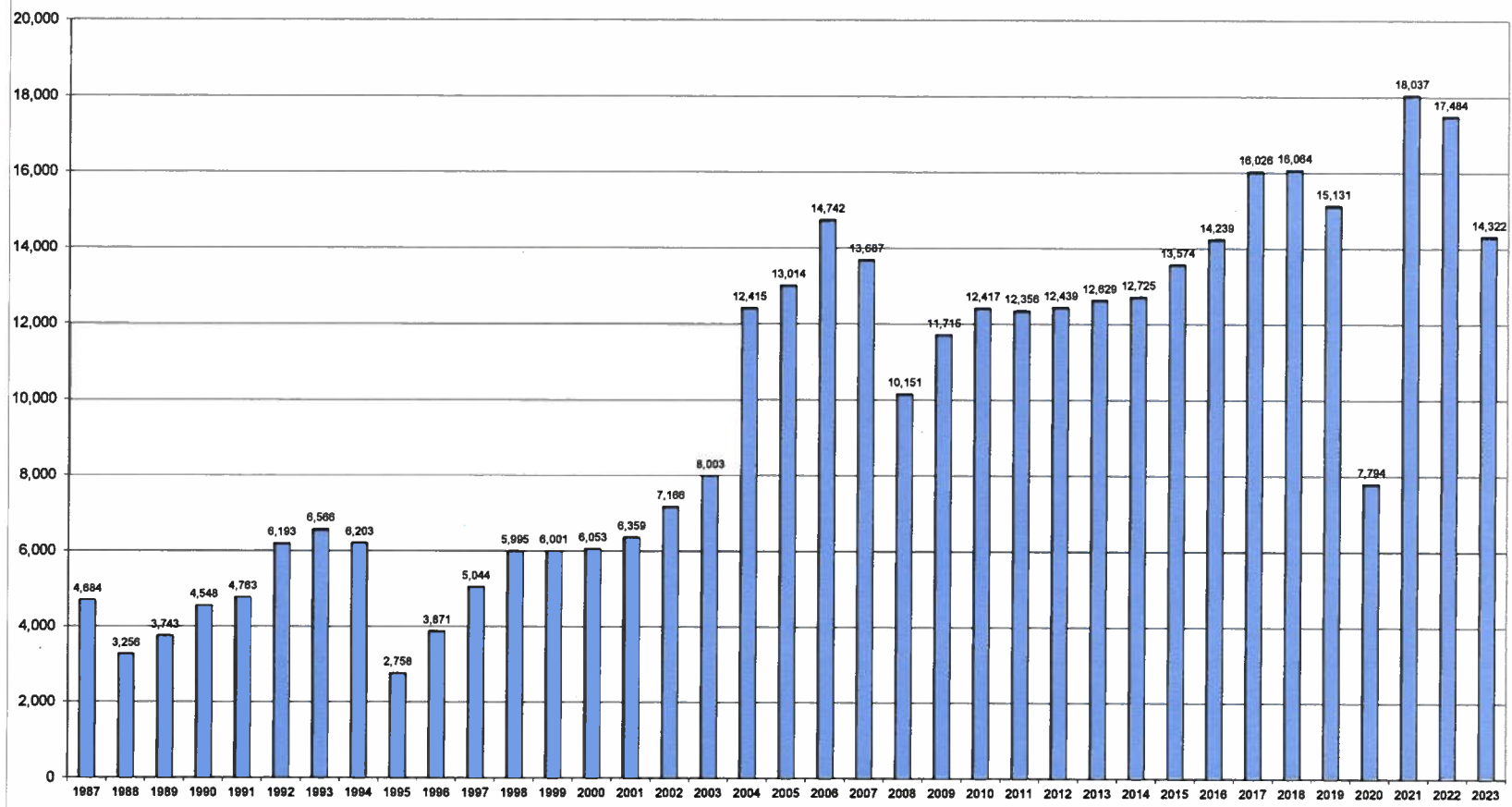


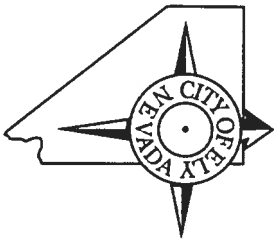
