Monthly Operations Report for February 2024

- 1. Locomotive Status Updated
 - a. Locomotives in service: #93, #109, 204, Wrecking Crane A & Rotary B.
 - b. Locomotive 81 is out-of-service with running gear and boiler issues. The staff and volunteers have done incredible work on Locomotive 81. Progress has been made on the boiler issues, the Bissell post and the pilot truck.
 - c. Locomotive 801 is out of service with governor issues.
 - d. Locomotive 310 is out of service with a prime mover issues.
 - e. Locomotive 40 is out of service for her heavy repairs. We have started on her repairs; she will be out of service until 2025.
 - f. Locomotives out of service needing moderate repairs: #201.
 - g. Locomotives waiting funding for restoration: Steptoe Valley Smelting and Mining #309, Kennecott 802 and Rotary Snowplow 8 (for boiler overhaul.)
 - h. Locomotives out of service needing heavy repairs #80 and the military locomotives.
- 3. Rolling Stock Status No change
 - a. Passenger equipment in service: #07, #08, #09, Flatcar #23, Coach #5, Baggage Car/RPO #20, Outfit Car #06
 - b. Passenger equipment out of service: #10, #2 and #05 needing heavy repairs.
 - c. Cabooses in service: #3 and #22 are operational.
 - d. Cabooses out service: #5 and #6. Caboose #6 needs a 50-year waiver.
- 4. Track Status No change
 - a. Keystone Branch is open.
 - b. Adverse Branch is open.
 - c. Museum Branch is open.
- 5. Ridership and Ticket Sales Updated
 - a. In January, we carried 129 passengers. This year to date we have carried 267 passengers.
 - b. Since operations began in 1987, we have carried 365,081 passengers.
- 6. Economic Impact The average non-gaming & gaming daily expenditure per overnight visitor \$170. Economic impact for February 2024 was 129 x 80% x 170 = \$17,544. Economic impact year to date was 267 x 80% x 170 = \$36,312



Rescue 1-1998 HME Rescue/Engine 1000 Gallon water capacity. (Currently in use) replaced Recue 3 1978 Dodge purchased 20 years earlier.

Ladder 1 2008 Rosenbauer 75' Ladder Truck 400 Gallon water capacity. (Currently in use)

Engine 1- 2017 Rosenbauer Type 1 Engine 1500 Gallon water capacity. (Currently in use)
Purchased by Pennington Foundation. Volunteers contributed \$15,000.00 for equipment to outfit the engine.

- NFPA generally says first line fire apparatus should be replaced 10-15 years, and 15-20 for less frequently used fire apparatus.
- Rescue 1 is 26 years old.
- This unit responds to motor vehicle accidents in Ely and White Pine County and neighboring Counties and Utah.
- Parts are getting harder and more expensive to find.
- Currently working on a transmission issue.
- Battery chargers had to be fabricated in the cab to accommodate our new Battery
 Powered Extrication equipment. (This is a safety factor should we get involved in
 an accident, loose equipment in the cab.)
- The unit is having corrosion issues on the body and will probably need to have a frame inspection done soon also.
- A new apparatus is built with more safety features in case you are ever involved in an accident.
- If we have a catastrophic failure you can't just go to the dealership and buy one they
 are almost all custom built to fit a department needs and again this unit is 26 years
 old.

Jennifer,

Based on my math, the parcel for the new lease has 647 AUMs tied to it, so the new lessee would only be eligible for those 647 AUMs in the BLM allotment. That leaves 1,028 AUMs attached to the property that is no longer part of this lease. These remaining AUMs would essentially become unaccounted for which is not ideal on my end. They would be activated again if that parcel was leased out separately or included in the larger lease again. My suggestion is to attach all 1,675 AUMs to the 765 acres that are in the new lease. That would be the cleanest way of keeping track of and keeping all of the AUMs active.


