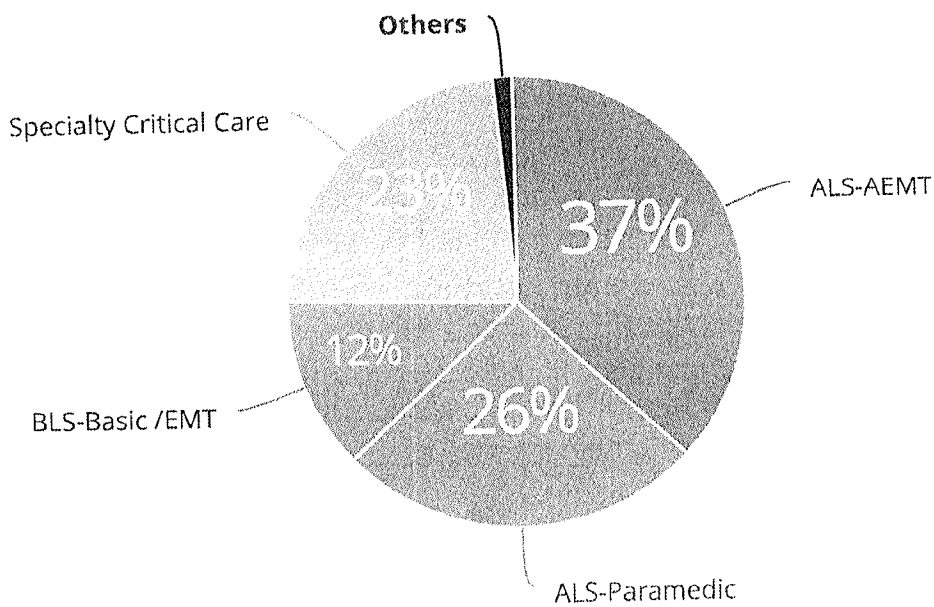

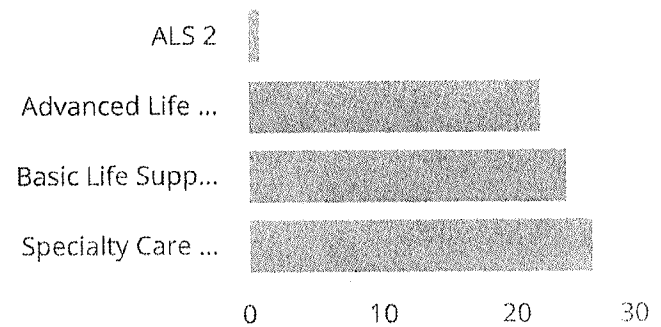

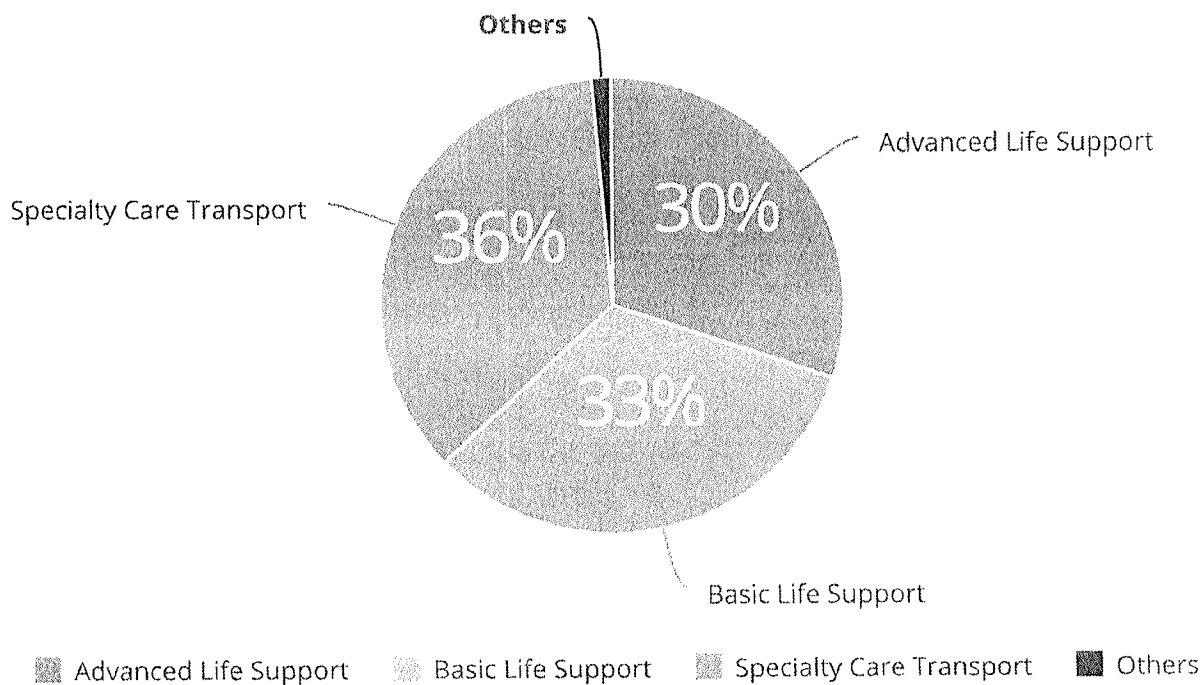

The Ely City of Ely Fire Department puts on annual Mass Casualty Incident training for the entire county including every agency available. This training is run as a "real incident" as only a hand full of individuals know the details of the incident (Ely fire chief, County Fire Chief, WP Sheriff, Ely Volunteer President, WP Dispatch, WBRH). All departments are notified of the day and the average time of the incident and nothing else. For this incident to run real world, actual requested resources are called and ordered, i.e. helicopter response, hospital status, mutual aid requests and any other resources needed. The incident includes live patients and actual transportation of patients to hospitals.

This years MCI was a simulated Mass shooting at the local City Hall Government Building, extending into Broadbent Park. In total there where 28 patients involved, including "the shooter". This training is an excellent source to show agency strengths and weaknesses for a real response to this type of incident. All agencies worked very well together and overall, we were happy with the results of this training and look forward to 2026.
