Re: Ely and White Pine County Urban Forest Rehabilitation grant

Jennifer, good afternoon.

As part of the NDF Ely and White Pine County Urban Forest Rehabilitation grant, we said we would make beneficial use of the chips and logs produced by the tree removals at the City Cemetery. To that end, and for the reporting, I have contacted 5 businesses in eastern Utah that advertised as doing raw wood mill work. None of the businesses found a need to use our logs to mill out. That is unfortunate as poplar is a good wood for cabinets and furniture. The companies contacted were: Parowan Timber and Beam, Wasatch Timber Products, True Mills, Quilter Construction and Rustica Hardware.

The golf course has agreed to take all the wood chips generated by this and other tree maintenance projects and use the chips for mulch around trees at the golf course and for weed suppression.

Randy Ewell has a group that has distributed firewood to needy families and will take cord wood for that public use.

We still haven't found a firm use for the very large bases of some of these trees. The difficulty in manipulating then is the biggest problem. Mr. Ewell would take them but splitting them is problematic due to their size. A local craftsman has expressed interest in logs no longer than ten feet and no larger than 24 inches in diameter for his portable milling machine. One complication is the logs should sit for a year before milling to reduce the probability of the wood checking or splitting after milling. I'm sure we will come up with a solution by the end of the reporting period.

The Ely Cemetery is a multigenerational cemetery within a multi-ethnic community and is located along the town's main street and visible to the community and visitors. Numerous large trees on the property are dead or dying. Boleana Poplars compose a large proportion of Ely's urban forest, many of which are declining citywide, potentially tied to a lowering water table, while other species such as spruce are overstocked leading to poor health. Removal of dead and thinning of over dense trees is needed to improve the grove health, along with the replacement of dead and dying trees with more climate adapted and resilient tree species. This decline in urban forest health calls for a survey of the public trees in Ely and will be done cooperatively with White Pine County and tribal communities to update the last survey which is over 10 years old.

Deliverables, reporting requirements and due dates:

- Tree removal and maintenance in Ely Cemetery:
 - Contract with a tree care company for 11 large, complex tree removals
 - o Prune for corrective health, the number of trees to be determined. Following leave fall a comprehensive evaluation of thee number of trees to receive corrective pruning will be done. The City has allocated \$20,000 for the removal of dead and dying trees. The number of trees to be pruned will be adjusted based on the remaining dollars and the City contribution.
 - Replant 11 trees with resilient species
 - o Staff will ensure newly planted trees will receive the needed water to thrive using existing irrigation. The current irrigation has been evaluated and is adequate to serve new planting.
- Tree Inventory
 - Conduct tree inventory for 11 city trees.
 - o Conduct tree inventory for Baker, Ruth, Lund, and Preston, towns in White Pine County
 - Completion of city and/or county tree management plan

Timeline:

Spring 2024: Get contract for tree maintenance. Get contract for tree survey. Get contract for replacement trees.

Fall 2024: Begin tree maintenance work and tree survey.

Spring 2025: Complete tree removal and maintenance

Fall 2025: The City will evaluate and deliver a management plan for the City and County> This will provide funds to be distributed the training for City and County workers The goal is to train City and County employees to reduce the need for contractors in the future. This allows the city and county to maintain this project.

Spring 2026: Planting of replacement trees for the cemetery (2" diameter minimum). Completion of tree survey and management plan for the city and county

Reporting:

The work outlined above will be completed over a [3]-year period beginning May 1, 2024, and ending March 1, 2027 City of Ely will provide to NDF quarterly performance reports for the previous quarter beginning in July 2024 and continuing through the life of the sub-award. The quarterly performance reports will include:

- · What was accomplished with the funds expended for the reporting period
- A comparison of actual accomplishments with goals and objectives

2 Procurement


