WHEREAS, the Ely City Council meets twice per month at 5:00 p.m.; and

WHEREAS, as a result of the meeting time, the Deputy City Clerk is paid overtime twice a month to attend these meetings, at the rate of 1.5 times their normal hourly rate; and

WHEREAS, in addition to the Deputy City Clerk, at times, other members of the City Staff, especially the departmental lead personnel are required to attend these after-hours meetings and as a result incur overtime as well, at 1.5 times their normal hourly rate; and

WHEREAS, the ELY CITY COUNCIL believes that cutting costs associated with holding these meetings is of great importance to the General Fund; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to City Code 1-5-5, which provides "The date and/or time of the regular meeting of the Ely city council may be changed by resolution"; and

WHEREAS, the City Council in trying to affect cost savings believe that changing the date and time of the City Council meetings is one of the measures that will be effective in reducing payroll costs affecting the General Fund.

Now, Therefore, in consideration of the Foregoing premises,

BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

The City Council shall meet on the second and fourth Friday of each month beginning, March 9, 2018, at 8:30 a.m.

INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT FOR SHARED ANIMAL CONTROL SERVICES

THIS AGREEMENT, made and entered into this 21st day of Qecember, 2015, by and between the County of White Pine, State of Nevada, by and through its Board of County Commissioners, of White Pine County, Nevada, hereinafter "County", and the City of Ely, an incorporated City in the County of White Pine, State of Nevada, by and through the Mayor and City Council of the City of Ely, hereinafter referred to as "City".

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the County and the City want to combine Animal Control obligations to provide better services to all citizens by utilizing assets of both White Pine County and the City of Ely and thereby decreasing duplicative services; and

WHEREAS, the County and the City are authorized by law to perform all duties hereunder by law; and

WHEREAS, the County and City are public agencies under NRS 277.100; and

WHEREAS, NRS 277.180(1) provides that any one or more public agencies may contract with any one or more other public agencies to perform any governmental service, activity or undertaking which any of the contracting agencies is authorized by law to perform;

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises and covenants herein, the Parties agree as follows:

1. Term.

- a. This Agreement shall be retroactive to July 1, 2015 and shall become effective on the date last signed above and shall continue in effect until termination in accordance with this section.
 - b. The term is to be through June 30, 2023.

2. The County will hereby provide use of the following:

a. All major maintenance will be a share cost 50%/50% between the County and the City. When vehicle replacement becomes necessary the City and County will work jointly to identify and pay for the replacement vehicle.



3. The City will hereby provide the use of the following:

- a. One full-time equivalent Animal Control Officer, with weekend, holiday and other time off support with other City personnel.
 - b. Training for the Animal Control Officer.
 - c. Record storage.
 - d. Office space and an appropriate Animal Control Facility.
 - e. Phone.
 - f. Email.
 - g. Fuel and routine maintenance on City vehicle.
- h. All major maintenance will be a share cost 50%/50% between the County and the City. When vehicle replacement becomes necessary the City and County will work jointly to identify and pay for the replacement vehicle.

4. Animal Control Services to the County

Animal Control Services to the County will include the tasks identified on "Exhibit A Scope of Work".

5. Financial Commitment.

- a. The County will pay the City \$30,000 divided into four quarterly payments of \$7,500 each. Payments will be due the first of each calendar quarter July 1, October 1, January 1 and April 1.
- b. The annualized payment due pursuant to the terms of this agreement shall increase each and every year for the term of this agreement by 1.5% beginning July 1, 2016.
- c. The Animal Control Officer, by and through City Hall, will collect all Animal Control fees, including animal control licenses for the City and the County.

6. Insurance.

- a. Workers Compensation Insurance. The City shall provide Worker's Compensation insurance at no cost to the County.
- b. Property, Equipment and Vehicles. The City shall be responsible for providing insurance for vehicles, equipment, buildings or any other ITEMS under its control.
- c. Liability insurance. The City will maintain liability coverage in an amount of at least \$2 million for services naming County as additional insured for its operations in fulfilling the Animal Control services contemplated by this Agreement.

7. <u>Hold Harmless and Indemnification.</u>

The City shall be solely liable for all acts of the Animal Control Officer as contemplated in this Agreement necessary for the provision of Animal Control services to the City. The City shall defend and hold the County harmless for all damages, injury, loss, expenses or liability incurred by the City and its employees, agents, and/or assigns while engaged in Animal Control services by the City, from any acts, failure to act, or omissions in connection with this agreement and all services hereunder, and shall not seek reimbursement or indemnification from the County, unless the complained of acts were taken at the specific direction of the County. There shall be no liability between the parties for any losses, expenses or damages that any other party may sustain as a result of any party failing or refusing to respond to an Animal Control related matter by City personnel.

8. <u>Evaluation of Animal Control Performance.</u>

- a. The County will be allowed to provide input to evaluation of Animal Control Officer's performance.
- b. A daily log will be maintained by the Animal Control Officer in Outlook or other similar software and will be submitted to the City Administrator and County Finance Director. This report will be sufficient as the monthly update provided to the County Commission.
- c. The City Administrator shall be the contact for complaints related to Animal Control. The City Administrator shall be responsible to resolve the complaints keeping the City Council liaison or County Commission liaison involved and informed as appropriate on all issues.

9. <u>Dispute Resolution.</u>

A four person committee comprised of two County appointed representatives and two City appointed representatives shall serve as the committee responsible to hear complaints of either the City or the County should there be issues that arise during the term of the contract. They will be responsible to provide recommendations to address concerns which will then be provided back to the City Council and County Commission.

10. Termination.

- a. This agreement will terminate on the earlier of:
 - i. the date provided in Section 1b, or
 - ii. when either party provides a six month written notice of its' intent to terminate the Agreement.

11. Severability.

In the event any of the terms, covenants or conditions of this Agreement or the application of them are held invalid by any court with jurisdiction, all other terms, covenants or conditions of this Agreement and their applications will not be affected thereby, but shall remain in force and effect unless the court determines that the provisions are not separable from all other provisions of this Agreement.

12. Amendment.

This Agreement may only be amended by consent of all parties.

13. Entire Agreement.

This Agreement constitutes the entire Agreement between the parties concerning its subject matter and there are no representations, conditions, warranties or collateral agreements, express or implied, statutory or otherwise, with respect to this Agreement other than is contained herein.

14. Additional Terms and Considerations.

a. The Animal Control Officer will remain an employee of the City.

- b. The City will provide required pay/benefits to their respective employee.
- c. The office of the combined Animal Control shall be the Animal Control Facility, located at or near the Regional Landfill.
- d. In the event that the County or the City experiences major changes in their need for services under this agreement, either party may request a meeting with the other to discuss the situation.

15. Review by Counsel

Each party to this Agreement and its counsel have reviewed this Agreement. The normal rule of construction to the effect that any ambiguities are to be resolved against the drafting party shall not be employed in the interpretation of this Agreement or any amendments to it.

16. Notices

Any notice, demand or request in connection with this Agreement shall be sufficient in all respects if given in writing and delivered in person, by facsimile or by certified mail to the parties as follows:

ANIMAL CONTROL SCOPE OF WORK

1. The Animal Control Officer shall:

- a. administer the Animal Control program for the City and the County pursuant to applicable City and County Codes;
- b. make recommendations to the governing bodies of both the City and the County on changes to their respective animal control ordinances and resolutions to provide a seamless process that will support the respective Codes and Ordinances;
- c. keep the governing bodies of both the City and the County apprised when changes to federal or state laws affecting animal control affect the governing bodies' codes and ordinances.

PROPOSED MOTION:

I MOVE TO APPROVE THE FIRST READING OF ORDINANCE 710, BILL NO. 2018-03, AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CITY CODE TITLE 3, CHAPTER 1, SECTION 4 GENERAL BUSINESS LICENSES, TO CHANGE THE DUE DATE OF ALL BUSINESS LICENSES TO JULY 1 OF EACH YEAR, TO ALLOW FOR THE PRO-RATING OF BUSINESS LICENSES FOR BUSINESSES STARTING ON A DATE OTHER THAN JULY 1 OF EACH YEAR

SUMMARY:

The City is currently working on ways to assist with cash flow transitioning into the new fiscal year. Business license fees paid by July 1 help provide available cash to pay bills going into the new fiscal year. The CTX revenues from the state are two months late and those funds are typically about half the total revenues going into the General Fund. Amending the Ordinance will bring all current and future license fees due by July 1 and allow new businesses to pro-rate their fee until the next due date of July 1.

BACKGROUND:

- 1. Prior to 2015, all annual business license fees were due by July 1. Ordinance 688 was passed on 10/8/2015 establishing business license fees to be paid one year after the initial purchase of the license for new businesses. The purpose was to encourage the startup of new businesses throughout the year instead of waiting until July 1 when the next year's renewal was due. For example, prior to Ordinance 688, if a business opened in March, a full-year's license fee was due, then the annual renewal would again be due in three months.
- 2. The City has relied on business license fee revenues to help offset initial expenditures in the first two months of the new fiscal year beginning July 1.

CURRENT SITUATION:

The City currently lists 46 active businesses whose license renewal dates fall outside the July 1 due date. The amended ordinance will bring those in line with the majority of renewals.

ANALYSIS:

- A. <u>FINANCIAL</u> Passage of this action item should help to stabilize cash flow moving into the new fiscal year.
- B. <u>TIMING</u> This ordinance would become effective twenty (20) days after its passage, approval and publication according to law.
- C. <u>POLICY/LEGAL</u> The Ordinance as written is approved as to form and content meeting the requirements of Chapter 266 and 268 as being within the authority of the City Council to set by Ordinance.

ALTERNATIVES:

Take no action

Taking no action would mean cash flow is reduced going into the new fiscal year.

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommend the Council approve Ordinance 710.

PROPOSED MOTION:

I MOVE THE CITY COUNCIL APPROVE RESOLUTION 2018-01: A RESOLUTION TO APPROVE THE CHANGE OF DAY AND TIME OF THE ELY CITY COUNCIL REGULAR MEETINGS TO 8:30 AM ON THE SECOND AND FOURTH FRIDAYS EVERY MONTH.

SUMMARY:

The City Council meets on the second and fourth Thursdays of each month at 5:00 PM with the exception of November and December where one meeting is held. We currently have at least one staff person (Deputy City Clerk) working overtime after 5:00 PM and any additional staff covered by the collective bargaining agreement required to attend a Council meeting results in overtime pay. Approval of the resolution would prevent overtime pay since meetings would be scheduled during regular work hours.

BACKGROUND:

- 1. The City has scheduled meetings in the evening to accommodate members of the public.
- 2. The counter to the above is that some individuals would be able to attend a day meeting time due to their current work schedule.
- 3. The Volunteer Fire Hall is available on Fridays.

CURRENT SITUATION:

The City is looking to reduce expenditures within the General Fund and 25% of the Deputy Clerk's overtime is charged to that fund.

ANALYSIS:

- A. <u>FINANCIAL</u> The financial impact to the General Fund is negligible due to Deputy Lee's pay being divided among the General Fund and the three Enterprise Funds. Estimating three hours per Council meeting, the cost would be about \$30.00 charged to the General Fund.
- B. <u>TIMING</u> We can proceed immediately to change meeting times upon passage of the motion.
- C. **POLICY/LEGAL** There are no significant policy issues with this resolution.

ALTERNATIVES:

Take no action on this item and we will maintain the current status quo for Council meetings.

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff has no recommendation for this resolution

PROPOSED MOTION:

I MOVE TO ACCEPT THE RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE CITY ADMINISTRATOR TO REDUCE SPECIFIC GENERAL FUND EXPENDITURES

SUMMARY:

There is an urgent need to reduce expenditures in the General Fund for the rest of this fiscal year ending on June 30, 2018. The largest expenditures in the Fund are wages and benefits. If the method of reducing costs examines wages and benefits, then what functions within the General Fund can be reduced to acceptable service levels?

BACKGROUND:

- 1. The City Treasurer is projecting a reduction in General Fund revenues for this fiscal year when compared to previous budget cycles.
- 2. The City Treasurer has made a presentation to the Council outlining a projected receipt of General Fund revenues this fiscal year of approximately \$1.9 million compared to a budgeted \$2.1 million. The projected shortfall would reduce the ending fund balance and could result in the City being placed under financial stewardship.

CURRENT SITUATION:

The City has twelve departments or functions for expenditure purposes within the General Fund: Executive Offices (Mayor & Council), Municipal Court, Clerk/Administration, Finance, City Attorney, Law Enforcement, Fire Dept., Public Works, Building Dept., Animal Control, Cemetery, and Parks. With the exception of Public Works and Law Enforcement (interlocal agreement), the remaining departments have expenditures in wages and benefits. Examining service needs currently, the Parks/Cemetery Dept. has reduced service needs during the winter season, notwithstanding continued periodic work in recycling at the landfill and funerals. Parks/Cemetery currently has three employees.-Animal Control is another department which may be covered with a half-time officer and augmented on an as needed basis. Adding temporary help for the Parks/Cemetery would cost an additional \$15,000 based on hiring last year. Additional

reductions in expenditures may be considered in light of further analysis of General Fund revenues being received for this year.

In addition, I recommend a hiring freeze for the foreseeable future for positions within the General Fund.

ANALYSIS:

- A. <u>FINANCIAL</u> Reducing Animal Control to half-time, a reduction in force in the Parks/Cemetery, and not hiring temporary help this fiscal year should save approximately \$50.995.
- B. **TIMING** The City must begin now to reduce expenditures in the General Fund.
- C. <u>POLICY/LEGAL</u> If the City Council approves these recommendations, the City will need to follow the processes in Article 21 of the Collective Bargaining Agreement for the main Unit to complete the Reduction in Force, including bumping of staff. The City Council has the legal authority to conduct the layoff, (Article 15 and NRS 288.150(3)(b) as negotiated in Article 21), but must notify the Union of the layoff, who will be laid off, who will have a reduction in hours and the affected employees will need to be notified of the layoff and recall rights. Affected employees shall receive thirty (30) calendar days notice of the intent to lay them off or reduce their hours.

As a result of the layoffs, the City's unemployment compensation payments may increase as the laid off employee shall have the right to file for unemployment compensation and the person whose hours are reduced may likewise be entitled to unemployment compensation for the hours of work they are reduced by.

The Interlocal Agreement entered by the City with White Pine County requires the City to maintain a Full-Time Animal Control Officer with weekend, holiday and other time off support by other City personnel. See paragraph 3 (a) of the Interlocal Agreement. The County could request a corresponding reduction in its payment to the City due to the reduction from a Full-time to a part time Animal Control Officer.

ALTERNATIVES:

Take no action

Taking no action means not addressing the lower revenue projections.

RECOMMENDATION:

Reduce the animal control position to half-time, reduce one employee in the Parks/Cemetery Dept., no hiring of temporary help this fiscal year and a hiring freeze for positions within the General Fund.

after travel has been approved. Employees should submit a written request to their supervisor when travel advances are needed.

- G. With prior approval, employees on business travel may be accompanied by a family member or friend, when the presence of a companion will not interfere with successful completion of business objectives. Generally, employees are also permitted to combine personal travel with business travel, as long as time away from work is approved. Additional expenses arising from such non-business travel are the responsibility of the employee. The employee shall indemnify, defend and hold the City completely harmless for any and all claims arising out of his/her request to allow someone to accompany them on the trip. The City shall be in no way liable for any losses incurred by the employee or any family member or friend resulting from their participation in travel. The employee shall be required to use his/her own personal vehicle if taking a family member or friend on any business trip.
- H. A trip report for all training travel involving seminars for the City is required. The trip report shall include a brief discussion of the reason for the trip, what was achieved or learned, and how the trip was beneficial to the City.
- I. When travel is approved, the employee should contact their supervisor for guidance and assistance on procedures related to travel arrangements, travel advances, expense reports, reimbursement for specific expenses, or any other business travel issues.
- J. Abuse of this Business Travel policy, including falsifying expense reports to reflect costs not by the employee, can be grounds for disciplinary action, up to and including termination of employment.

ARTICLE 20 MEDICAL AND LICENSE REQUIREMENTS

Any and all fees and/or costs associated with employee requirements for licensing and/or examinations necessary for continuing employment shall be paid for by the City.

ARTICLE 21 LAY OFF

- A. Seniority is defined as length of service with the City of Ely.
- B. Seniority by department shall be the determining factor in the case of layoff, demotions (in lieu of layoff) and recalls. Layoffs shall be in reverse order of seniority. Any employee who is laid off may bump an employee in another department with less seniority, when the job descriptions and skills of the positions are similar or less. The City shall give written notice thirty (30) calendar days prior to an employee's layoff or demotion in lieu of layoff. A City wide re-employment list shall be established for employees affected by layoffs and/or demotions. Seniority with the City is the priority of the re-employment list. If an employee is offered re-employment, but not qualified for the position, the City would continue down the list

until they find an employee qualified. If no employee is qualified, then the City shall offer to train, by seniority, an employee on the list willing to train for the position. If an employee refuses an offer of re-employment, for which she/he is qualified, the employs shall be removed from the list. Recall to employments shall occur in inverse order of layoff.

- C. If an employee exercises bumping rights into another classification, the employee would retain his/her step on the wage scale in the new classification.
- D. Any regular status employee reduced in grade or laid off under this Article shall have his/her name placed on the appropriate recall list as determined by the following:

Employees with:

- 0 to 8 Years of Service = 1 year recall period 8 or more Years of Service = 2 year recall period
- E. The City will maintain the official recall list. Any employee who has been laid off shall be notified through certified mail, return receipt requested, at his/her last known address, of an offer of recall and shall, within twenty-one (21) calendar days from the date of mailing, respond affirmatively in person to the City Administrator of acceptance of the offer of recall. Failure to respond within the twenty-one (21) calendar day period will constitute waiver of the right to recall and that person will be removed from the recall list. An employee must be available for work within two (2) weeks of acceptance of the offer. Upon recall after layoff, the time that the person was on layoff shall be counted as a break in service; however, the employee, upon return, shall resume accruing all benefits at the same level as at the time of layoff.

ARTICLE 22 LEAVE OF ABSENCE

I. Leave of Absence Without Pay

- A. Leave without pay may be granted only to an employee who desires to return to City Service.
- B. Leave without pay for less than thirty (30) calendar days must be granted by the City Administrator.
- C. Leave without pay for thirty (30) calendar days or more may be granted for the good of the public service by the City Council.
- D. The employee shall retain his/her status as a public employee and the pay, leave and benefits accrual level as prior to the approved leave.

Ok, if you are able to pull the City out of this financial crisis what are the plans for the future? Have you thought about meeting with the School District, Hospital District and the County to try and renegotiate the CTX distribution for a greater percentage? On your agenda item 8 C#5 where Robert Switzer is proposing to have a reduction in force in the General Fund to cut expenses, needs to have more realistic thought put into it to make it work. I would like to know why Robert is looking at cutting the dedicated hard working city employees jobs or cutting back on their hours when it isn't their fault the city finances were run into the dirt by the administration. I think the Mayor and City Council needs to look at other alternatives in saving monies in the General Fund. Some food for thought for the Mayor and City Council is, you people helped put the City in the financial condition it is in so all of you should look at giving up your pay as Mayor and City Council for the next 5 months which would save the City over \$18,000 in itself. You need to seriously look at shutting down the recycling plant until the General Fund recuperates. With Robert's plan on a reduction in force you are going to be short handed in manpower in the General Fund to operate the Recycling Center and if you use the Landfill Crew or the Street Department you are going to have to reimburse any of these non General Fund employees for their time, so you won't be saving monies in the General Fund. You can't keep on using the Street Department as they have too much work that needs to be done on the streets and don't have the time to work the Recycling Center. Even before you have your reduction in force you used the Street Department 5 times in January when they should have been removing snow off the streets. Another way to save money is to make the Deputy City Clerk an exempt employee and you won't have to pay her overtime to attend the Council Meetings and you won't have to move the meeting date and time. Lay off the City Administrator and split the work between the Deputy City Clerk and the City Treasurer. This would save you close to over \$100,000 with his wages and benefits. Cut the City Attorney back to a part time employee and cut his wages accordingly. Take away the Attorneys million dollar life insurance policy and make him have the same life insurance policy as the rest of the city employees. Cut the City Engineer back to a part time position as you can't afford to do any work so why pay him close to the \$150,000 to \$200,000 per year you have been paying him. The Ely City Council has voted unanimously to support the application of the Nevada Northern Railway Foundation to open the historic railroad track between the Nevada Northern Railway National Historic Landmark and the White Pine Public Museum.

The track that the Foundation wants to restore is the original mainline of the railroad that was built in September 1906 and still exists. Opening this track between the two museums will increase visitation to both museums. The Foundation has committed to operate tourist trains between the two museums once the track is restored.

As part of the project, the Foundation proposes to also pave the existing gravel walking trail between the two museums. Doing so, will encourage visitors to walk the less than a mile path between the two museums when trains are not operating.

RE: NRS 41.0385

NRS 41.0385 requires that the attorney for each local government must file with the clerk of it's governing body by February 1st, a summary of all claims made against that government for tortious conduct. The summary must be categorized by wrong alleged and certain details provided for each claim. A copy of NRS 41.0385 is attached.

We made an abstract of the POOL's claims records for claims made during 2017. The qualifying tort claims have been transferred to the attached summary of claims form to assist you in complying with the law by February 1, 2018. Please make sure to advise the member to file a copy with the clerk or secretary of their board; or if this does not apply then the report is to be kept on file so that if a public request is made to see it, it will be available. We **do not** need a copy of the report back confirming the filing of the report.

If your agency was not a member of the Nevada Public Agency Insurance Pool during all of 2017, you should search your records for other claims to be added to the report. Also, if you know of any claims meeting the criteria under the law that are not shown in our report, please amend the report accordingly.

NRS 41.0385 Claims made against state agencies and local governments for tortious conduct: Annual filing of summary of claims with Secretary of State or clerk of local government; summaries of claims are public records.

- 1. On or before January 10 of each year, for the preceding calendar year, each agency represented by the Attorney General shall submit to the Attorney General a summary of all claims made against the agency for tortious conduct. On or before February 1 of each year, the Attorney General shall compile the summaries submitted pursuant to this subsection and file the compilation with the Secretary of State. The compilation is a public record open to inspection.
- 2. On or before February 1 of each year, for the preceding calendar year, the district attorney, city attorney or other attorney on behalf of each local government shall compile and file with the clerk of its governing body a summary of all claims made against that government for tortious conduct. The summary is a public record open to inspection.
- 3. The claims summarized pursuant to this section must be arranged by category of wrong alleged, such as battery, false arrest, negligent injury, wrongful death, and the like, and divided by status into:
 - (a) Claims paid;
 - (b) Judgments entered but unpaid; and
 - (c) Claims pending.
- A total must be shown for each status in each category, and a total overall for each status and each category.
 - 4. For each claim must be shown:
 - (a) The name of the claimant:
- (b) The amount paid, reduced to judgment, or claimed, as the case may be, including fees and costs determined; and
 - (c) The type of wrong alleged.
- 5. A court order sealing the record of a proceeding does not prevent the disclosure of the information required by this section, or excuse the attorney for the state or local government from providing that information.
