Re: Analysis of Processing Utility Billing In-House or with an Outside Service

Mayor Van Camp, Council Members, and Utility Board Members,

The City of Ely currently utilizes Freedom Mailing Services, Inc., to process, print, and mail out monthly utility bills. The scope of their service includes communicating with the United States Postal Service (USPS) on recent changes of address, printing the bill statements, include printing public service announcement messages with each bill, print barcodes for both mail sorting and our own individualized barcode to speed up and reduce errors in processing payments, and sort and mail the bills per USPS regulations to utilize the best discounts in mailing costs.

The monthly billing also involves our accounting software provider, Caselle, and Express Bill Pay which is our new billing and payment processing service. The City of Ely mails out an average of 4,175 utility bills each month at a cost of \$0.355 each, or \$1,482.13 total which includes postage. Additionally, we purchase 12,700 postcards every three months at a cost of \$0.045 each, or \$571.50. Together the monthly processing, mailing, and postcard costs from Freedom Mailing Services comes to \$.40 for each utility statement. Current cost of mailing a postcard is \$.35 each.

In order for the City to realize the significant mailing discounts available, we would need to purchase software which communicates through a database with the USPS. Those costs are estimated to be upwards of \$5,000 or more plus regular updates. We would need to purchase a bulk mail permit costing \$225.00 plus an annual fee of \$225.00. A condition of bulk mail permit holders is a requirement to sort and band each mailing by zip code and state. The City could consider purchasing a dedicated mailing printer able to handle card stock and reducing additional wear/tear and toner costs on our current printer. One model of printer for lower volume requirements runs \$2,995 (copy included).

Another factor which is more difficult to evaluate is the time needed by staff to process the bills. It is easy to understand that our two staff members with the title, Utility Clerk, might assumed to be working on just utility billings each and every workday. The reality is that depending on circumstances on any given day, our utility clerks are fielding questions, complaints, and suggestions about a myriad of issues on the telephone or at the front counter which have very little to nothing involving utility issues. In other words, they are the front-line, initial contact citizens have regarding every type of issue for a city.

I believe we should continue with Freedom Mailing Service for our utility printing and mailing. Our clerks are better utilized with collecting and accounting for payment receipts, answering inquiries from citizens, processing and collecting business licenses, and collecting various fees and charges as required by our ordinances.



Guidelines / Requirements for Printing on Envelopes and Postcards

When using envelopes and postcards, use the guidelines given below.

Envelopes

An envelope is a more complex object than a single sheet of paper. For this reason, it may not be possible to obtain consistent printing quality over the entire envelope surface. Use the following guidelines to select the proper envelopes.

Envelopes should have the basis weight of 70 to 100g/m2 (0.16 to 0.22 lb./ream) and up to 4 plies of the paper that is used to construct the paper including all flaps and overlaps.

Envelopes should have **sharply-creased folds** and accurately joined corner edges.

Envelopes should have a smooth, **uncoated surface**. Envelopes that are too smooth, however, can give an adverse effect to the drum and fuser units inside the printer.


Envelopes should have a long grain orientation.

Envelopes should have a pulp content of all least 80%, and should have a moisture content of 4 to 6%.


Envelope Paper Grain

Normally when envelopes are manufactured they have a diagonal grain direction, For optimal results, use envelopes that have the grain running parallel to the length (long grain)


Figures below shows some typical envelope types:



This is the type of envelope best recommended for use with the bulk paper feeder.



Although this type of envelope generally feeds normally, they are somewhat prone to jamming than above.



This type of envelope performs reliably, provided that envelopes are loaded so that the bottom (sealed end) feeds into the printer first.



Avoid using this type of envelope made of double-ply paper.

Before printing on envelopes of any type, test printing performance. Avoid using any of the following kinds of envelopes even if the envelope meets the requirements above.

Envelopes that have an exposed adhesive surface, or having a peel-off sealing string for adhesive surface. (Peeled-off sealing string inside the printer can cause a serious problem).

Envelopes with metal fasteners or tie strings.


Envelopes with transparent windows, holes, perforations, or cutouts.


Envelopes made using paper, pigment, adhesive, or other material that will degenerate or release hazardous gases when subjected to the heat that is generated in the printer.

Envelopes that are bent, dirty, or redundant of paper dust.

Curled Envelopes


An envelope tends to curl excessively or become uneven in its thickness since it is constructed by paper which is folded, creased, and seamed in many parts, making the stack of envelopes on the feeder tray unlevel. To avoid feeding problems, the unevenness of the stack of envelopes on the paper tray must be less than those specified in the following figures:






Vertical curl must be less than 10 mm.

Horizontal curl must be less than 5 mm.






Thickness in bottom or top must be less than 10 mmThickness in right or left trails must be less than 5 mm.

Reduce the envelopes, if necessary to keep the unevenness of the stack of envelopes within the specified limit.

The paper used in postcards should have a basis weight of 135 to 190 g/m2 (0.3 to 0.42 lb./ream) and uncoated. The paper should also satisfy the same conditions as white bond paper.

I am speaking tonight in regards to the Animal Control Advisory Board that the city council will be voting on shortly.

The forming of this board holds the potential to benefit animal control, the animal control facility, the city of Ely and our community in so many ways, and it will create the opportunity for more citizens to become directly involved with helping the city to move forward with improving animal control.

There is already a group of citizens who have been working together, along with Andrew Hayes, to network the pound animals to help get them adopted, pull animals out of the pound for temporary foster when there is no more room and they have reached or exceeded their 10 day time limit, to locate no-kill shelters or rescues that will then take these animals in, to then transport the animals to said facilities and to get the animals vetted and vaccinated when needed prior to transport, all at no cost to the city! During the last two weeks we have moved 6 dogs out of the pound and into no-kill shelters and currently have 4 more scheduled for transport this coming Wednesday, and it would have been a total of 13 dogs overall between both transports, but 3 dogs were adopted shortly before they were scheduled to leave Ely. Many of these same people are also interested in being on, or contributing to the proposed animal control advisory board. This board could take some burden off of the city by doing research and applying for grants to help improve animal control and it's facility, find a way to put together a volunteer group to work with and socialize the animals, therefore increasing their chances of being adopted, as well as to help with the care and up keep of the animal control grounds when the ACO needs to respond to calls and attend to other duties within the community. This board could also help to organize fund-raisers and adoption events for the animals, help to educate the public on spaying/neutering/vaccinating/licensing and other aspects of being a

responsible pet owner, and the list goes on while the possibilities are endless!

I know that there is some skepticism as to whether or not a board such as this will be a success or a failure, but in reality the only real failure is a venture never tried....so what have you got to lose? 





- c. Since operations began in 1987, we have carried 274,702 passengers.


6. Paint the Railroad Red Week





Soon to come will be Dirt Key Chains and T-Shirts. And we are working on a stuffed animal version of Dirt.








Total Ridership

BILL NO. 2018-07 ORDINANCE NO. 714

An Ordinance creating Title 6, Chapter 12 entitled Off Highway Vehicles, establishing rules for operation within the incorporated City of Ely, routes authorized for use as ingress and egress from the City of Ely to public and private lands where off highway usage is authorized and setting the penalties for violations of this Ordinance.

WHEREAS, N.R.S. 266.105 empowers the Ely City Council to pass ordinances necessary for the municipal government and the management of the affairs of the City, for execution of all powers vested in the City, and for making effective the provisions of Chapter 266 of the Nevada Revised Statutes; and

WHEREAS, NRS 490.100 provides the City with the legal authority to adopt NRS 490 provisions for operation of off highway vehicles and establish routes where off highway vehicles may be authorized; and

WHEREAS, the City wishes to encourage tourism and use of the outdoor spaces within White Pine County and recognizes that visitors to White Pine County routinely lodge in our hotels; and

WHEREAS, to encourage tourism for outdoor enthusiasts, especially those accessing public lands with off highway vehicles to stay in Ely, which will increase room stays and restaurant usage; and

WHEREAS, the City is promulgating this Ordinance in order to comply with the requirements of Nevada Revised Statutes to establish access routes and limit uses of the off highway vehicles for purposes of ingress and egress to public and private lands only.

NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Ely DOES CREATE ELY CITY CODE TITLE 6, CHAPTER 12 AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1: ORDINANCE ENACTMENT

Chapter 12 OFF HIGHWAY VEHICLES

- 6-12-1: STATE OFF HIGHWAY VEHICLE LAWS ADOPTED
- 6-12-2: HIGHWAYS AND ROADS IN THE CITY OF ELY DESIGNATED FOR PURPOSES OF OHV TRAVEL
- 6-12-3: DESIGNATION OF STATE HIGHWAYS
- 6-12-4: RESTRICTIONS
- 6-12-5: ENFORCEMENT
- 6-12-6: **PENALTY**

6-12-1: STATE OFF HIGHWAY VEHICLE LAWS ADOPTED:

All laws governing and regulating certification and operation of off highway vehicles as set forth in chapter 490 of Nevada Revised Statutes are adopted and hereby incorporated herein.

6-12-2: HIGHWAYS AND ROADS IN THE CITY OF ELY DESIGNATED FOR PURPOSES OF OHV TRAVEL:

- A. The following roads and highways within the City of Ely are designated as permissible for the operation of off highway vehicles for the limited purpose of allowing off highway vehicles ingress and egress to private or public areas that are open for the use of off highway vehicles. Off highway vehicles shall not be operated on designated highways or roads for any purpose other than travel to or from (ingress and egress) the private or public area open for the use of off highway vehicles.
- 1. Mill Street from Highway 6 on the southern portion of Mill Street to Hayes Street, then east across Murry Street and onto Campton Street terminating at Great Basin Boulevard.
- 2. Avenue I beginning at Great Basin Boulevard continuing east to 8th Street East, south to Avenue M and north to Avenue H, east on Avenue H, terminating at Fifteenth Street East.
- 3. Avenue H and Eleventh Street East (now known as Nevada Northern Rail Way) north terminating at Avenue C.
- 4. Avenue M beginning at 8th Street East continuing east to the end of the paved road.
- 5. 13th Street East beginning at Avenue H and continuing south to Madison Avenue. Madison Avenue west to Pioche Highway, south to the intersection of Great Basin Boulevard and Highway 6. West on Highway 6 to Pinion Road, less than one half mile.
- 6. Avenue C beginning at the railroad tracks on the east side of town, continuing west which then changes name to North Street at 7th Street East, terminating at Faye Avenue.
 - 7. Faye Avenue beginning at North Street and terminating at High Street.
- 8. High Street beginning at Faye Avenue and continuing west to 7th Street, south on Lyons Avenue terminating at 5th Street. South on 5th Street terminating at Campton Street.
 - 9. 11th Street beginning at High Street and continuing south to Campton Street.
- 10. Courthouse Canyon Road, beginning at Campton Street and continuing south across Highway 6 along the dirt road until the edge of the City limits.

- 11. JV Walker beginning at Campton Street and continuing south approximately ½ mile to trail leading to Highway 6, crossing over Highway 6 at Bobcat Drive to the dirt track south of high school and north of Great Basin College.
 - 12. Ogden Avenue beginning at Aultman Street, north to Lackawana Road.

6-12-3: DESIGNATION OF STATE HIGHWAYS:

Any highway or road not designated in 6-12-2 as an authorized route, shall not be used for ingress or egress to public or private lands designated for off highway vehicle use. No OHV traffic shall be allowed upon Aultman Street, except to cross over at designated crossings.

6-12-4: RESTRICTIONS:

- A. A person who is less than sixteen (16) years of age or any person without a valid driver's license, is prohibited from operating an off highway vehicle on a designated highway unless supervised by a person who is at least eighteen (18) years of age and holds a valid driver's license.
- B. *Helmet*: All persons operating an OHV on the designated routes for ingress and egress from public or private lands for purposes of recreation, or from their place of residence or lodging to access designated routes, are required to wear a helmet pursuant to NRS 490.130 (3). The penalty for failing to wear a helmet shall be the same as that of a motor cyclist who fails to wear a helmet.
- C. Comply with all traffic laws: Irrespective of age, all operators of an off highway vehicle are required to comply with all traffic laws of the City and/or the state of Nevada.
- D. *Speed Restriction*: Due to concerns for public safety and the peace and quiet of neighborhoods in which off highway vehicles are allowed to operate for ingress and egress purposes, or from place of residence or lodging, there is established a speed limit of 15 miles per hour for all off highway vehicles, as defined by NRS 490.060, on all designated routes. It is unlawful to travel in excess of 15 miles per hour when operating an off highway vehicle at any time within the City of Ely.
- 1. The minimum penalty for violation of this speed limit shall be one hundred fifty dollars (\$150.00) for speeding 1-4 miles per hour over the speed limit; and
- 2. a fifty dollar (\$50.00) increase for every five miles per hour, or portion thereof, over 15 miles per hour.
- E. *Registration*: Each off highway vehicle operated on the routes established by this ordinance must be registered and displaying the registration at all times of operation pursuant to NRS 490.130 (2). Failure to have the required registration shall result in a fine consistent with the failure to have a motor vehicle registered.

- F. Operation of off highway vehicle on other than an approved route shall be unlawful. It shall be unlawful to operate an off highway vehicle on any route, other than an approved route for ingress into and egress from the city. The operator of an off highway vehicle must use the most direct route from their place of lodging or residence, to the nearest approved route for ingress and egress purposes, or for purposes of accessing fuel. The minimum penalty for violation of this provisions shall be two hundred and fifty dollars (\$250.00).
- G. *Time restrictions*: use of the designated routes for off highway traffic shall be limited to thirty minutes prior to sunrise until thirty minutes after sunset.

6-12-5: ENFORCEMENT:

- A. The White Pine County Sheriff's Office and the Nevada Highway Patrol shall enforce the provisions of this ordinance and shall have the authority to issue a traffic citation to the person suspected of a violation of this ordinance. If the person to be cited is a minor, law enforcement shall cite the juvenile into the White Pine County Juvenile Court. All other violations shall be cited into the Ely Municipal Court.
- B. All fine amounts are subject to state mandated assessments.

6-12-6: PENALTY:

Any person violating any of the provisions of this chapter shall, for each such offense, be subject to penalty as provided in section 1-4-1 of this code, unless a different penalty is provided herein.

- **Section 2.** <u>Effective Date.</u> This ordinance shall become effective twenty (20) days after its passage, approval and publication according to law.

BILL NO. 2018-07 ORDINANCE NO.714

An Ordinance creating Title 6, Chapter 12 entitled Off Highway Vehicles, establishing rules for operation within the incorporated City of Ely, routes authorized for use as ingress and egress from the City of Ely to public and private lands where off highway usage is authorized and setting the penalties for violations of this Ordinance.

WHEREAS, N.R.S. 266.105 empowers the Ely City Council to pass ordinances necessary for the municipal government and the management of the affairs of the City, for execution of all powers vested in the City, and for making effective the provisions of Chapter 266 of the Nevada Revised Statutes; and

WHEREAS, NRS 490.100 provides the City with the legal authority to adopt NRS 490 provisions for operation of off highway vehicles and establish routes where off highway vehicles may be authorized; and

WHEREAS, the City wishes to encourage tourism and use of the outdoor spaces within White Pine County and recognizes that visitors to White Pine County routinely lodge in our hotels; and

WHEREAS, to encourage tourism for outdoor enthusiasts, especially those accessing public lands with off highway vehicles to stay in Ely, which will increase room stays and restaurant usage; and

WHEREAS, the City is promulgating this Ordinance in order to comply with the requirements of Nevada Revised Statutes to establish access routes and limit uses of the off highway vehicles for purposes of ingress and egress to public and private lands only.

NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Ely DOES CREATE ELY CITY CODE TITLE 6, CHAPTER 12 AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1: ORDINANCE ENACTMENT

- 6-12-5: ENFORCEMENT
- 6-12-6: **PENALTY**

6-12-1: STATE OFF HIGHWAY VEHICLE LAWS ADOPTED:

All laws governing and regulating certification and operation of off highway vehicles as set forth in chapter 490 of Nevada Revised Statutes are adopted and hereby incorporated herein.

6-12-2: HIGHWAYS AND ROADS IN THE CITY OF ELY DESIGNATED FOR PURPOSES OF OHV TRAVEL:

- A. The following roads and highways within the City of Ely are designated as permissible for the operation of off highway vehicles for the limited purpose of allowing off highway vehicles ingress and egress to private or public areas that are open for the use of off highway vehicles. Off highway vehicles shall not be operated on designated highways or roads for any purpose other than travel to or from (ingress and egress) the private or public area open for the use of off highway vehicles.
- 1. Mill Street from Highway 6 on the southern portion of Mill Street to Hayes Street, then east across Murry Street and onto Campton Street terminating at Great Basin Boulevard.
- 2. Avenue I beginning at Great Basin Boulevard continuing east to 8th Street East, south to Avenue M and north to Avenue H, east on Avenue H, terminating at Fifteenth Street East.
- 3. Avenue H and Eleventh Street East (now known as Nevada Northern Rail Way) north terminating at Avenue C.
- 4. Avenue M beginning at 8th Street East continuing east to the end of the paved road.
- 5. 13th Street East beginning at Avenue H and continuing south to Madison Avenue. Madison Avenue west to Pioche Highway, south to the intersection of Great Basin Boulevard and Highway 6. West on Highway 6 to Pinion Road, less than one half mile.
- 6. Avenue C beginning at the railroad tracks on the east side of town, continuing west which then changes name to North Street at 7th Street East, terminating at Faye Avenue.
 - 7. Faye Avenue beginning at North Street and terminating at High Street.
- 8. High Street beginning at Faye Avenue and continuing west to 7th Street, south on Lyons Avenue terminating at 5th Street. South on 5th Street terminating at Campton Street.
 - 9. 11th Street beginning at High Street and continuing south to Campton Street.
- 10. Courthouse Canyon Road, beginning at Campton Street and continuing south across Highway 6 along the dirt road until the edge of the City limits.

- 11. JV Walker beginning at Campton Street and continuing south approximately ½ mile to trail leading to Highway 6, crossing over Highway 6 at Bobcat Drive to the dirt track south of high school and north of Great Basin College.
 - 12. Ogden Avenue beginning at North Street, north to Lackawana Road.

6-12-3: DESIGNATION OF STATE HIGHWAYS:

Any highway or road not designated in 6-12-2 as an authorized route, shall not be used for ingress or egress to public or private lands designated for off highway vehicle use. No OHV traffic shall be allowed upon Aultman Street, except to cross over at designated crossings.

6-12-4: RESTRICTIONS:

- A. A person who is less than sixteen (16) years of age or any person without a valid driver's license, is prohibited from operating an off highway vehicle on a designated highway unless supervised by a person who is at least eighteen (18) years of age and holds a valid driver's license.
- B. *Helmet*: All persons operating an OHV on the designated routes for ingress and egress from public or private lands for purposes of recreation, or from their place of residence or lodging to access designated routes, are required to wear a helmet pursuant to NRS 490.130 (3). The penalty for failing to wear a helmet shall be the same as that of a motor cyclist who fails to wear a helmet.
- C. Comply with all traffic laws: Irrespective of age, all operators of an off highway vehicle are required to comply with all traffic laws of the City and/or the state of Nevada.
- D. *Speed Restriction*: Due to concerns for public safety and the peace and quiet of neighborhoods in which off highway vehicles are allowed to operate for ingress and egress purposes, or from place of residence or lodging, there is established a speed limit of 15 miles per hour for all off highway vehicles, as defined by NRS 490.060, on all designated routes. It is unlawful to travel in excess of 15 miles per hour when operating an off highway vehicle at any time within the City of Ely.
- 1. The minimum penalty for violation of this speed limit shall be one hundred fifty dollars (\$150.00) for speeding 1-4 miles per hour over the speed limit; and
- 2. a fifty dollar (\$50.00) increase for every five miles per hour, or portion thereof, over 15 miles per hour.
- E. *Registration*: Each off highway vehicle operated on the routes established by this ordinance must be registered and displaying the registration at all times of operation pursuant to NRS 490.130 (2). BILL NO. 2018-08 ORDINANCE NO. 715

An Ordinance creating Title 3, Chapter 14 entitled Mobile Food Vendors, establishing the business license requirements, application process and appeals process.

WHEREAS, N.R.S. 266.105 empowers the Ely City Council to pass ordinances necessary for the municipal government and the management of the affairs of the City, for execution of all powers vested in the City, and for making effective the provisions of Chapter 266 of the Nevada Revised Statutes; and

WHEREAS, NRS 266.355 (1) empowers the Ely City Council to regulate all businesses, trades and professions and to fix, impose and collect a license tax for revenue upon all businesses, trades and professions.

WHEREAS, NRS 446.877 prohibits the City from issuing a license to a food establishment without the food establishment having a permit issued by the health department unless an Ordinance is adopted by the City Council to issue a "contingent" license pending receipt of the permit from the health department; and

WHEREAS, the City of Ely's business licensing scheme does not provide for the mechanism for a "mobile" food establishment to apply for and be considered for, a business license; and

WHEREAS, the City is promulgating this Ordinance in order to comply with the requirements of Nevada Revised Statutes and Nevada Administrative Code before a business license may be issued to a mobile food establishment.

NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Ely DOES CREATE ELY CITY CODE TITLE 3, CHAPTER 14 AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1: ORDINANCE ENACTMENT

CHAPTER 14

MOBILE FOOD VENDORS

3-14-1: DEFINITIONS.

As used in this chapter, unless the context otherwise requires, or the words are otherwise defined below, the words and terms used in this chapter have the following meanings:

- A. *City* has the meaning ascribed to it pursuant 1-3-2.
- B. City Administrator, City Clerk, or City Clerk/City Treasurer means the Chief Administrative Officer of the City of Ely.

- C. *Mobile food vendor* means, but is not limited to, any person or employee or agent thereof carrying on or conducting the business of selling ice cream, fruit, candy, vegetables, meats or any other edible foods, raw, prepared, loose or packaged, from a motor vehicle, or other type of food service conveyance, approved or required to be approved, by the statutes or Nevada Administrative Code of the State of Nevada governing such vehicles, conveyances and sales practices.
- D. *Employee* means a person who works for or under the direction of, on behalf of, or as an agent of a licensee.
 - E. Health District means the State of Nevada Health District.
- F. *Licensee* means the holder of a mobile food vendor business license issued by the City.
- G. *Vehicle* means a motorized vehicle, as well as a trailer or other portable unit that is drawn by a motorized vehicle and is intended for use in vending.
 - H. *Vend* means to sell or offer to sell food products from a vehicle.

3-14-2. PURPOSE AND INTENT—REGULATION.

It is found and declared that the public health, safety, morals, good order and general welfare of the residents of the city require the regulation and control of all mobile food vendors. All mobile food vendors shall be licensed and regulated so as to protect the public health, safety, morals, good order and general welfare of the inhabitants of the city and to safeguard the public. It is further found and declared that the right to obtain such a license is a privilege and that the license may be suspended, limited or revoked for violation of the conditions of this chapter. In conformity with the policy of this chapter, the following persons are declared not to be qualified to hold a license under the provisions of this chapter:

- A. A person who violates, or has violated, the provisions of this chapter despite notice by the city;
- B. A person who has been convicted of a crime involving theft, fraud, dishonesty, receiving or possessing stolen property, any controlled substance violation or any sex offense;
- C. A person whose license, issued under the provisions of this chapter, or those ordinances or statutes of any other agency lawfully engaged in the licensing or regulation of businesses as defined in this chapter, has been denied, suspended or revoked for cause;
- D. A person who, at the time of renewal of any license issued under this chapter, would not be eligible for such license upon a first application;

- E. A partnership, limited partnership association, limited liability company, or other business entity unless all of the members of such partnership, limited partnership association, limited liability company, or business entity are qualified to obtain a license;
- F. A corporation, unless it is incorporated in the State of Nevada, or unless it is a foreign corporation which is qualified under Nevada law to transact business in Nevada; or
- G. A corporation, if an officer or director thereof would not be eligible to receive a license for any reason which would disqualify an individual applicant.

3-14-3: UNLAWFUL TO OPERATE WITHOUT LICENSE.

It is unlawful for any mobile food vendor to engage in the business of mobile food vending within the city without first obtaining a license therefor in compliance with the provisions of this chapter.

3-14-4: LICENSE; APPLICATION; CONSENT TO INVESTIGATION.

Whenever a person desires to conduct any of the activities of a mobile food vendor in the city, such person shall completely execute the following:

- A. The application specified in 3-1-2;
- (1) A description of the selling methods to be used and the nature of the products or services to be offered;
 - (2) Proof of filing with the State of Nevada Department of Taxation;
- (3) A health permit for each vehicle, documentation that the vehicle is eligible for such permit, and a health card for each operator (all issued by the Health District);
- (4) A copy of a valid, unexpired Nevada vehicle registration, if applicable, and insurance for each vehicle; and
- (5) Such other information or documentation as the City Administrator may require in order to establish the applicant's suitability and fitness for approval.
- B. *First Time Applicant*: In the case of a first time applicant for a mobile food vendor license in the city, he/she shall submit a statement of places where he/she has resided during the past five (5) years, whether or not he/she has engaged in the mobile food vendor business previously and if so, the jurisdiction in which licensed for each past business, on a form prescribed by the city clerk/city administrator or designee, accompanied by a set of fingerprints recently taken or taken at the Ely City Hall at the time of submitting the application.

- C. Written Application: Any person desiring a mobile food vendor license shall submit a completed written application on the form provided by the city clerk/city administrator or designee, submitting the annual payment of the applicable business license class fee, and the completed business license application and investigatory fee pursuant to chapter 1 of this title.
- D. Submission to the City: The city clerk/city administrator or designee shall, upon receipt of the application and all attachments, review the application for acceptance or rejection. If, after review of the application and the results of the investigation by the City, the City Administrator or designee reject an applicant, the applicant shall be refunded the business license fee, but no the investigatory fee, within thirty (30) calendar days of rejection.

E. Application Due Dates:

- 1. New applications are accepted at any time by the city clerk/city administrator or designee.
- 2. Renewal applications shall be accepted by the city in such time as to allow the renewal to occur no later than July 1 of each year.

F. *Location restrictions:*

- (1) Except as otherwise provided in Subsection (2) of this Section, no mobile food vendor shall:
- (a) Have any exclusive right to any location upon the streets, sidewalks, alleys, or public grounds of the City;
- (b) Vend in any congested area where the operation will impede pedestrian or vehicle traffic;
 - (c) Remain in any one location for more than one (1) hour; or
- (d) Park within 500 feet of the property line, in any direction, of any brick and mortar restaurant within the City of Ely.
- (2) The provisions of Subsection (1) of this Section do not apply to the operation of a mobile food vendor at a particular location if and to the extent the vendor is operating at that location pursuant to a contractual arrangement with the City; or the mobile food vendor is located at a particular location pursuant to a special event license issued pursuant to chapter 3-2-5-2 of these codes.
- (3) Every mobile food vendor shall return to the "Servicing area" as defined in NAC 446.031 at the end of every work day.

3-14-5: INVESTIGATION FEES; EMPLOYEES OR AGENTS TO QUALIFY THE SAME AS THE APPLICANT.

- A. An applicant is required to pay to the City the investigation fee as set forth in chapter 3-2-11-4, for each person required to be licensed, as well as, for each driver.
- (1) No refund on investigation fee: Even though an applicant may be denied a license after investigation, no part of the investigation fees deposited shall be returned to the applicant.
- (2) Withdrawal of application; Refund: If any applicant withdraws their application prior to the beginning of an investigation, all investigation fees deposited shall be returned to the applicant within thirty (30) calendar days of written notification of withdrawal.

B. Investigation and issuance.

- (1) Upon receipt of the application, the City shall refer the applicant or employee or agent thereof to the White Pine County Sheriff's Office which shall cause a background investigation of the applicant's and driver's local criminal history and the Nevada Sex Offender Registry.
- (2) Upon the City Administrator's review of the application, the City Administrator shall refuse to issue a license to the applicant for any of the following reasons:
- (a) Persons convicted of any crime equivalent to a Nevada category A felony regardless of jurisdiction in which conviction occurred;
- (b) Persons convicted of any felony involving the use of violence against another person;
- (c) Persons being supervised by the department of parole and probation, or its equivalent entity from another state, who lack written approval to work in a licensed establishment from the supervising agency;
- (d) Persons who have been convicted of any felony where firearms were used in the commission of a crime;
- (e) Persons who have been convicted of any felony or gross misdemeanor where the predicate crime was theft, false pretenses, unlawful use of a credit card, or identity theft.
- 3. **Council Discretion**: A person who has successfully completed felony or gross misdemeanor probation or parole and whose civil rights have not been restored or who has not received a pardon may be entitled to a certificate at the sole discretion of the city council.

- 4. **No Negative Law Enforcement Contact For Three Years**: Except for those persons falling under subsection B2(a) of this section, any other person who would otherwise be ineligible for a mobile food vendor license and/or work card due to conviction, who can establish the satisfactory completion of probation or parole and who has had no negative law enforcement contact for three (3) consecutive years following completion of probation, parole, jail or prison sentence may apply to the city council for a mobile food vendor license and/or work card. The city council retains the sole right to authorize the issuance of a mobile food vendor license and/or work card.
- 5. **No Negative Law Enforcement Contact For Five Years**: Except for those persons falling under subsection B2(a) of this section, any other person who would otherwise be ineligible for a mobile food vendor license and/or work card due to a conviction, who can establish the satisfactory completion of jail, prison, probation or parole and who has had no negative law enforcement contact for five (5) consecutive years following completion of probation, parole, jail or prison sentence shall be eligible for a mobile food vendor license and/or work card without city council approval.
- 6. **Failure To Disclose**: Failure to fully disclose a felony or gross misdemeanor criminal conviction will be sufficient grounds for denial or immediate revocation of a certificate.
- 7. **Grievance**: Any person aggrieved by the denial or revocation of a mobile food vendor license and/or work card may seek a review hearing before the city council by filing a request for review with the city clerk or designee within thirty (30) calendar days of the announcement of the denial or revocation.
- (a) Failure to appear before the city council and/or to provide clear and convincing evidence demonstrating an error was made in the denial determination or failure to provide clear and convincing evidence meeting the requirements of subsection 4 or 5 of this section will result in an affirmance of the denial.
- (b) A majority vote of the city council is required to overturn a denial or revocation subject to the mayor's right to veto.

3-14-6: FEES; FURTHER REGULATIONS.

- A. Mobile food vendors shall be subject to the fees set forth in section 3-1-4.
- B. Each mobile food vendor shall be in compliance with the regulations enacted by the health district, Nevada Revised Statutes and Nevada Administrative Code, and shall show written evidence of the same, prior to issuance of a license by the City.
- C. No licensee hereunder may lease, rent, or otherwise hire a vehicle to another for use as a mobile food vendor's vehicle. Every driver shall be a licensee hereunder, or the direct employee of such licensee and shall be required to obtain a work card from the City.

- D. During the hours that schools are in session and during the period of one-half hour before or after the times posted on the applicable school zone signs, no mobile food vendor shall sell or solicit, or attempt to sell or solicit, or park a vehicle:
- (1) within 500 feet in any direction from the extreme outside perimeter of any school property and/or adjacent park grounds; or
 - (2) within a posted school zone.
- E. No mobile food vendor shall enter on private property, knock on doors, ring any bells, or otherwise disturb persons in their residences. This section shall not apply, however, when the mobile food vendor has been specifically invited to the residence by the owner, resident, occupant or person legally in charge of the premises.

3-14-7: EXHIBITION OF LICENSE.

All mobile food vendors are required to exhibit their licenses at the request of any customer or potential customer, city official or peace officer.

3-14-8: TRANSFER PROHIBITED.

It shall be unlawful for any mobile food vendor to transfer his license to any other person.

3-14-9: LICENSE; SUSPENSION, REVOCATION; LIMITATION.

The city council may suspend, revoke, withdraw or discontinue any license granted under the provisions of this title whenever the council has reason to believe that the business conducted thereunder by the licensee, his servants or employees, is a nuisance, a menace to public health or detrimental to the peace and morals of the city, or that violations of the laws of the state or of the ordinances of the city have been committed or are being permitted to be committed upon the premises where such business is being conducted. Such suspension, revocation, withdrawal or discontinuance shall be by resolution duly made and carried and spread upon the minutes of the council.

3-14-10: LICENSEE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE ACTS OF EMPLOYEES.

Every licensee shall be responsible for the acts of his employees and agents committed during the course of employment or licensed activity. In any license suspension, limitation or revocation proceedings, the fact that the licensee did not have actual knowledge of the events complained of shall be no defense, and every licensee hereunder accepts his license subject to said condition.

3-14-11: LICENSEE'S AGREEMENT TO CONFORM TO LAW.

Acceptance of a license constitutes an agreement on the part of such licensee to be bound by all of the regulations of the city as the same now are, or may hereafter be amended or promulgated, applicable Nevada Revised Statutes and Nevada Administrative Codes. It is the sole responsibility of the licensee to keep themselves informed of the content of all such rules and regulations, and ignorance thereof will not excuse violations.

3-14-12: PENALTY:

The violation of any provision of this chapter where no previous penalty is provided for shall be punishable as provided in section 1-4-1 of this code and, upon conviction thereof, the court may revoke any and all such licenses which may have been issued hereunder to the person for such business.

- **Section 2.** <u>Effective Date.</u> This ordinance shall become effective twenty (20) days after its passage, approval and publication according to law.
