The meeting may be closed by appropriate motion for the purpose of discussion on any matter allowed under N.R.S. 241.031 and 241.033, (1) nothing contained in this chapter prevents a public body from holding a closed meeting to consider the character, alleged misconduct, professional competence or physical or mental health of a person/employee. (2) A public body may close a meeting upon a motion, which specifies the nature of the business to be considered. (3) This chapter does not: (a) Apply to judicial proceedings. (b) Prevent the removal of any person who willfully disrupts a meeting to the extent that its orderly conduct is made impractical. (c) Prevent the exclusion of witnesses from a public or private meeting during the examination of another witness. (d) Require that any meeting be closed to the public. (e) Permit a closed meeting for the discussion of the appointment of any person to public office or as a member of a public body. (4) The exception provided by this section, and electronic communication, must not be used to circumvent the spirit or letter of this chapter in order to discuss or act upon a matter over which the public body has supervision, control, jurisdiction or advisory powers.

GRANT OF RIGHT-OF-WAY EASEMENT

KNOWN ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS: That <u>City of Ely</u> the "Grantor", whose address is <u>501 Mill Street Ely NV</u>, <u>89301</u> for a good and valuable consideration, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, does hereby grant unto <u>Mt. Wheeler Power</u>, <u>Inc.</u>, a Nevada corporation whose address is 1600 Great Basin Blvd., Ely, Nevada 89301, and to its successors or assigns, the right to enter upon the lands of the undersigned, situated in the County of <u>White Pine</u> State of <u>Nevada</u>, more particularly described as follows:

A 15' wide unobstructed strip of land located in the NE 1/4 of Sec 22 T.16 N., R.63 E., M.D.B.& M. The Easement shall begin at the south corner of parcel 002-280-16 and run west cutting through the parcel for approximately 130' feet until it enters the transformer located on the south east corner of the fire station building. The easement shall extend for 7.5' on either side of the existing buried power line.

The lines of this easement shall be lengthened or shortened, if necessary, to terminate at end lines, in addition, such area as may be necessary to properly install guy wires and anchors for line angle and dead-end structures located in the right-of-way.

and to locate, establish grade, construct, reconstruct, rephase, repair, operate and maintain above, under, over, across, or on the above described lands and/or in, above, over across, under or upon all streets, roads or highways abutting said lands, an electric transmission and/or distribution line or system to use; to cut, trim and control the growth by machinery or otherwise of trees and shrubbery located within 7.5 feet of either side the buried power line, or that may interfere with or threaten to endanger the operation and maintenance of said line or system; and the right of ingress to and egress from said easement over and across the Grantor's lands by means of roads or lanes thereon, if such exist, otherwise by such route or routes as cause the least practicable damage and inconvenience to Grantor.

The Grantor agrees that all poles, wires, cables, conduits, crossarms, conductors, ducts, manholes, transformers, fixtures, and other appurtenances, installed above, over, under, across or on the above described lands at Mt. Wheeler Power, Inc.'s expense shall remain the property of Mt. Wheeler Power, Inc., upon termination of this Grant of Right-of-Way Easement. Any incurred costs for maintenance, upgrading, or rerouting of the powerline due to placement of fences, trees, concrete, asphalt or anything that would interfere with excavation of the powerline would be billed to and the responsibility of the grantor or its successors and assigns. The grantor, successors or assignees agree to not place or construct any buildings or structures inside the 15' right of way without prior written approval by Mt Wheeler Power engineering department.
